







## Regional Model Forest Network – Asia

2025 Annual Advisory Committee Meeting 24 February – 1 March 2025 Carood Watershed Model Forest, Bohol, the Philippines

Draft Concept Note, Tentative Agenda and Daily Schedule as of 21 February 2025 (subject to change)

#### **Background**

The Regional Model Forest Network-Asia (RMFN-Asia) is a community of practice promoting the sustainable management of forest landscapes using the Model Forest approach. It was established in 2000 and is now one of six regional networks under the International Model Forest Network (IMFN). The RMFN-Asia is composed of eight Model Forests in six countries (Thailand, China, India, Japan, Indonesia and the Philippines). Viet Nam is also considering establishing a Model Forest. The network is governed by a voluntary Advisory Committee, which is chaired by Preecha Ongprasert, Director of the Forestry Foreign Affairs at Thailand's Royal Forest Department. RECOFTC has been serving as the RMFN-Asia Secretariat since January 2024.

The Philippines has been participating in the RMFN-Asia since the creation of Ulot Watershed Model Forest in Samar (2000) and the Carood Watershed Model Forest in Bohol (2010). In addition to the local Model Forest leadership, the national focal point for the Philippines continues to be the Forest Management Bureau (FMB) of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).

At the most recent meeting of the RMFN-Asia Advisory Committee held in January 2024 in Lampang, Thailand (home of the Ngao Model Forest), Carood Watershed Model Forest was proposed to be the location of the 2025 RMFN-Asia Advisory Committee meeting. The dates for the event are 24 February – 1 March 2025.

RECOFTC as RMFN-Asia Secretariat would co-organize the meeting with DENR – FMB and DENR – Region 7, the Carood Watershed Model Forest Management Council, and other relevant Carood Watershed Model Forest stakeholders. RECOFTC would cover the international travel, meals, and accommodation of a maximum of 30 RMFN-Asia representatives and selected observers, as well as cover a portion of the local activity costs, which would include a two-day field visit organized by local Model Forest Stakeholders. Carood Model Forest stakeholders and the DENR – FMB and DENR – Region 7 are requested to provide logistical support to identify and book the meeting venue, organize the field day, and provide a welcome dinner. Strategic international partners and those from the Philippines would also be invited to attend at their own cost.

#### **Objectives**

- Exchange and reflect upon the current situation of Model Forests in Asia (including key successes, challenges, and lessons learned)
- Discuss and identify priority areas and opportunities to promote and advance Model Forests in Asia
- Learn firsthand from the experiences of Carood Watershed Model Forest through a two-day field visit
- Prepare for the IMFN Global Forum at Eastern Ontario Model Forest in Canada in May 2025
